




1.1 Age profile of active participants with an approved plan (no. of participants)




1.2 Primary disability of active participants with an approved plan










3.1 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with an approved plan by support category (%)



3.3 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with an approved plan by age group (%)











3.2 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with an approved plan by primary disability (%)





3.4 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with a function score and an approved plan by level of function (%)






















6.13 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 7 to 14 yrs










6.21 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 15 to 24 yrs






6.29 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 25+ yrs


